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## Law Day Shabbat April 29, 2017

Law Day Shabbat, a joint project of Temple Israel and the Wilkes-Barre Law & Library Association, will be held on April 29, 2017 starting at 9:30 am in the Sanctuary. Law Day Shabbat serves to underscore the positive role of attorneys in the secular and religious community. We know that the law has a central role in Jewish society for it is written in Deuteronomy 16:20 "Justice, justice shalt thou pursue."

**Johanna Gelb and Barry Dylor**, co-chairs of the program, are pleased to announce that this year marks the 13th anniversary of this unique program. We are particularly pleased that **Andrew P. Miller** will be our featured speaker.

Andrew P. Miller is an Associate Professor of Political Science at Wilkes University. He teaches courses in comparative politics and international relations and specializes in the politics of Latin America. His last two books are:

*Ecotourism Development in Costa Rica: The Search for Oro Verde* (2012) which examines the role of ecotourism as a development strategy in Costa Rica and his most recent book, *Sustainable Ecotourism in Central America: Comparative Advantage in a Globalized World* (2016) which examines the development of ecotourism in Nicaragua, Panama and Belize.

Dr. Miller has established two international programs for student travel, both in Costa Rica. Each spring, Dr. Miller leads a group of students to San Marcos de Tarrazú, Costa Rica where they learn about the international coffee trade while completing a series of community service projects. In addition, every other summer, Dr. Miller leads a group of students to the Guanacaste province of Costa Rica to assist local officials in better developing their ecotourism industry. Dr. Miller is also the Director of the Wilkes University Model United Nations team which includes a yearly trip to New York to represent a UN member state at the meeting. In 2017 Wilkes will represent Belize. Dr. Miller has a B.A. from Illinois College, an M.A. from Illinois State University and a PhD from Purdue University.

# Rabbi Kaplan *Writes...*



Dear Friends,  
For the second year in a row I stood with many hundreds of Christians at the Crossroads Community Church near Rehoboth

Beach, Delaware in March. This year I was joined by Rev. Bob Zanicky of First Presbyterian Church in Wilkes-Barre, who sang Jerusalem of Gold with me at the Stand with Israel event. Gerri and I made the drive at the request of our friends Beverly and Bruce Cottle who now live there. The spiritual music, the Israeli and American flags waving, the excitement of the crowd and the intensity of the love for Israel was memorable. The program is sponsored by CUFI, Christians United for Israel, a 3.5 million member organization comprised of mostly evangelical Christians and led by the fundamentalist pastor John Hagee. I first heard Pastor Hagee when he was interviewed by Dennis Prager many

years ago, and was impressed by his movement's commitment to Israel. The program was powerful and the keynote speaker was Pastor Dumisani Washington, an African American preacher who has devoted much of his recent ministry to helping African families, especially in Ethiopia, to move into the 20th Century. He is an expert on the situation in the Middle East, and is a frequent visitor to Israel. He detailed the countless opportunities the Arabs have had to live in peace with Israel, to get the territorial concessions they have demanded, and to provide a bright future for their children. His clarity and knowledge were stellar.

I also participated in a panel discussion about Judaism with two other Rabbis. Rabbi Sacks is from Wilmington and has been supporting this event for the past six years by bringing the Delaware Shlichah (representative) from the State of Israel to address the five or six hundred people in the audience. The other Rabbi is the founder of an Israeli organization called Just One Life whose aim is to

help pregnant Israeli women to have healthy pregnancies and hopefully avoid abortion if they are in crisis.

It never occurred to me that what we take for granted in America- generally undeterred abortion by any pregnant woman who wishes to end her pregnancy- could be a very ominous reality in Israel. While I see clear moral issues with regard to abortion, as well as holiness issues with it, since Judaism allows for abortion I've never considered it an existential concern for the Jews of America. But in Israel, where every Jewish life is counted next to the ever increasing Arab population within Israel and beyond its borders, each time an abortion takes place we lose another Jewish life that could keep the Zionist dream alive.

Without coercion and simply with counseling and education, the Just One Life organization has helped 17,000 Jewish babies (as well as Muslim and Christian babies too) increase the Jewish population of Israel.

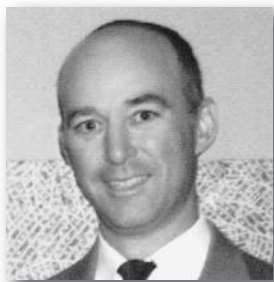

# Cantor's Notes

Jews like questions. The Rabbis of the Talmud learn about and decide points of law by asking questions from every angle, sometimes leaving the original question unanswered!

The average Jewish person grows up encouraged to ask questions about everything; probably the inspiration for the expression "two Jews, three opinions." This challenging, questioning nature that we Jews nourish ultimately leads to a greater understanding of our God, our heritage and our values.

The Passover Seder is all about asking and answering questions. *Ma Nishtana Haliylah Hazeh* -Why is this night different? Why do we eat (or abstain from) certain foods? What did God expect from our ancestors and what does he expect of us?

Many people at the Seder ask: Why do we have to talk about all of this again? We know the story – we've heard it so many times! The *Haggadah* provides the answer. Even if we all were experts on every aspect of Jewish history and law, we would still be obligated to re-tell the story. Why? Because we are to feel as if we personally experienced the miracle of the Exodus. *L'tziat Mitzrayim* (the Exodus) was the main event in our transformation from an enslaved band of tribes to an organized nation under God's law. It is tied to

the very soul of every Jew, defining the kind of people we are commanded to be.

The core of being Jewish is social justice. Since the time of the prophets, our credo has been "to do justice, love mercy and walk humbly with God." So many *mitzvot* connected to our "Egyptian experience" remind us to further the cause of social justice - take care of the poor, treat the stranger and the fatherless with care and respect, because we were slaves in the Land of Egypt and therefore should understand their plight.

One of the first songs we sing in the Haggadah is *Ha Lachma Anya*, which includes the line, "*Kol dichsif yeitei v'yeichol* - Let all who are hungry come and eat." The Seder is not just a celebration; it is reminder of who we are, and what we value. But there is more than just historic significance to this passage. So many of us today feel we don't have enough money, enough possessions, enough time. As 20th century American philosopher Eric Hoffer put it, "You can never get enough of what you don't really need to make you happy." *Ha lachma anya* reminds us to appreciate what we have and to be happy and satisfied with our lot. Again quoting Hoffer, "The hardest arithmetic to master is that which enables us to count our blessings." *Ha lachma anya* also implies that as long as there is hunger, as long as there are still people in need, perhaps we are all still slaves, not yet worthy to fill the cup of salvation.

**Carole, our children and I wish you a happy and inspirational Passover!**

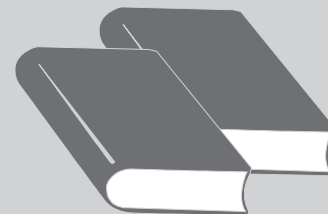

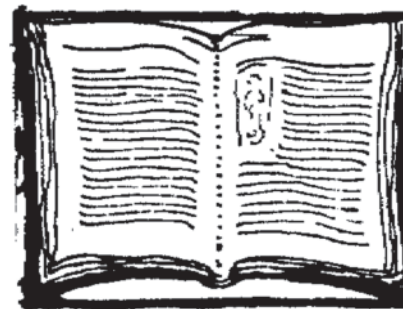
## Scholarship Aid Available for USCJ Summer Programs
