Temple Israel Centennial Celebration



Rev. Dr. Robert Zanicky will once again join Rabbi Kaplan on the bima for a special service. Members of First Presbyterian Church will also join us for Shabbat services and kiddush.

Our Centennial Celebration was an exceptional day that began with a special Shabbat service and kiddush. **Dr. Burton Benovitz** chanted the Haftarah and the other Past-Presidents in attendance shared highlights of their presidencies. That evening, a captivating performance of Broadway hits by superstar, **Norm Lewis,** followed a Havdalah service and video presentation commemorating our 100 years. The celebration continued in the vestry with champagne, desserts and an abundant display of historical photos and memorobilia.



Rabbi Kaplan Writes...

On our High Holidays I shared some thoughts based on the theme of the ancient statement in the

Mishneh "Al Shlosha Dvarim Ha'Olam Omed"- Upon three things the world stands: "Al HaTorah, v'al ha'avodah, v'al g'milut chasadim"- Upon Torah, upon worship, and upon acts of loving kindness. I suppose the meaning may be that if one of these essential pillars falls, then the world falls as well.

For Torah we spoke about different types of knowledge, and how parents, teachers and Jewish Law all derive from that same word, Torah. For Avodah we mentioned different kinds of prayer and focused on **Abraham Heschel's** approach to making prayer and worship as meaningful and exciting as possible. And for **gemilut chasadim** we remembered the loving kindness of our parents and shared the hope that we will carry on that legacy of goodness.

And there was a fourth sermon, the one I shared on the second day of Rosh Hashanah. The sermons are on our website for anyone that is interested. That second day **sermon was about Israel**.

Israel just had its elections. They were rather contentious, and many in the media have expressed fear over the win by the right-wing parties and **Benjamin**Netanyahu as Prime Minister. But Israelis themselves aren't nearly as concerned about a right-wing government as the press, and American Jews seem to be. And still, I believe Israel has much more to be concerned about than its government. It has to fear the mistake it has made in dealing with the Palestinians.

My talk was not about unfair treatment or West Bank settlements. It was about the great opportunity Israel had to bring Arabs and Jews together in Israel, and the result of squandering that opportunity.

Imagine the **United States** following the blatant racism of the 1940's and 1950's never having an opportunity to become racially intermingled. How many family members or friends or co-workers would we know of a different skin color had we not integrated our schools and had we kept laws against interracial marriage on the books? Very few. There wouldn't have been any opportunities for intermingling. But sitting on the school bus, sitting in the classroom and playing in the school yard brought about a major change in our social circles.

It took decades to accomplish, but we did it. The racism we speak of today in America is based on microaggressions. We have done such a good job that people have had to invent (or recreate) racial theories to the point that our children are being told that life in America couldn't be worse for people of color these days. And yet anyone who can remember the 1940's and 1950's knows that compared to those days; racism is practically gone today.

And Israel today between the Arabs and the Jews is like America between the white folks and people of color in the 40's and 50's. And the reason is that Israeli Jewish kids and Israeli Arab kids don't ride the school bus together. They don't play on the playground together, and they don't even go to the same schools. The schools in Israel are completely segregated. Orthodox Jewish kids have one set of schools, Arab kids have another, and secular Israeli kids another. Arab and Jewish families barely know each other. They and their children do not have play dates together, they do not play sports together and they almost never are invited over for holidays or meals.

But it is worse than **American segregation**. Because Arab adults and children believe that Jews not only hate them, but wish to see them dead. And Israeli adults and children believe the same about Arabs. And this has been going on for 75 years. It must change, and it will probably take half a century to do so. But only very few people are even talking about the possibilities.

One group that is talking is called "Roots."

These are Arab/Palestinian folks and Jewish/Israeli folks who have begun a conversation that has led to an organization with workshops, meals and cultural events with both Arabs and Jews and especially their children. It was started by an Orthodox Jewish "settler" in the West Bank and a Palestinian Arab fellow whose paths crossed and they realized that neither of them hated the other, despite the fact that they both believed that the land they lived on belonged to their own group. They each had their own narrative of who belongs in that spot. And finally, after all these years, they began to listen to each other's story. And that has led to friendships and understanding.

Together with some local organizations we hope to bring these two gentlemen to visit our community in the spring and share the possibilities for a future where Arabs and Jews can live not only in peace side by side or on the same block in Israel, but as friends.

May the blessings for 5783 fill your family's life and may the days ahead be filled with joy.

Cantor's Notes



I love Thanksgiving - a holiday

celebrated by Americans of various religions and ethnicities, showing gratitude for all the good things in our lives. Indeed, President Abraham Lincoln made Thanksgiving a national holiday to unify the nation after the Civil War. We all grew up with the traditional Pilgrim story. The deeply religious Pilgrims saw themselves as new Israelites in a new "promised land." They found inspiration in Leviticus Ch.16, where God commands the Israelites to observe the Feast of Booths, and "to rejoice before the Lord your God" at the time of the fall harvest. There are other connections between Thanksgiving and Sukkot. In ancient times, our ancestors made a "pilgrimage" to Jerusalem to give thanks for a plentiful harvest, dwelling in booths during the week-long festival. Likewise, the Pilgrims lived in makeshift huts (Wetus) that the Wampanoag helped them build during their first winter in Massachusetts.

Wait, what about the Wampanoags? According to the story, the English-speaking **Tisquanto (Squanto)** and their chief, **Massasoit** welcomed the Pilgrims and helped them settle into "their" new land. How do the descendants of those native Americans remember that first Thanksgiving?

Unfortunately, to the Wampanoags Thanksgiving is "The National Day of Mourning." A broader perspective on the history of that period reveals a more complicated version of what happened. English traders/slavers, arriving several decades before the Pilgrims brought with them European diseases that decimated the Wampanoag. In fact, they lost 90% of their population by the time the Pilgrims landed on their shores (70,000 down to about 5,000). Squanto knew English only because he had been kidnapped and sold into slavery in Europe 10 years prior. He had managed to return home, only to find his entire village wiped out by disease. The beautiful cleared land where the Pilgrims built their settlement (Plymouth) had been the site (Patuxet) where Squanto's tribe had lived for centuries. Reluctantly, the Wampanoags decided to make a treaty with the Pilgrims only because they needed help defending themselves from the Narragansetts. If the Pilgrims had tried to settle in the same spot 10 years before when the Wampanoag were strong, the colony of Plymouth likely would not have been established.

It all went downhill from there. More and more European settlers arrived and took over the land that Wampanoag ancestors had called their own for millennia.

Their language and culture were almost eradicated - no one spoke Wampanoag for nearly 150 years. Since 1993 dedicated members of the tribe have been working to revitalize their language, using a Bible written in Wampanoag (the first book printed in New England) and other documents - not unlike the scholars who brought back Hebrew as a spoken language a century ago.

So, can we still celebrate Thanksgiving, knowing the complete history? Of course we can! The Wampanoag people have a rich and beautiful culture and a relationship with the land dating back over 10,000 years. They give thanks to "Creator" (God) when they eat, cook, farm, fish, etc. And look at everything as gifts of Creator. All of those special Thanksgiving foods turkey, corn, cranberries, are traditional Wampanoag foods. We need to expand our mindset to include the indigenous people who are an integral part of this story. Taking that idea even further, perhaps Thanksgiving could become a holiday to celebrate all people who have immigrated to this country looking for a better life for themselves and their families. In doing so, we could make Thanksgiving a truly inclusive holiday for all Americans. -Cautor


